



COUNCIL PLAN 2017-2021

The Council is calling on the community to provide feedback on the draft Council Plan 2017-2021. Every four years councils across Victoria must develop a four year plan that identifies key priorities, projects and the best use of Council resources.

The Council held a number of open house sessions in March and April this year, in which more than 200 people provided feedback, gave ideas and suggestions.

2016/17 COMMUNITY SUPPORT GRANTS AWARDED

Congratulations to the many community organisations and individuals who successfully applied for grant funding as part of the Community Support Program.

A total of 51 grants were awarded as part of the program, with 39 community grants, three youth

participation grants and nine major event funding grants awarded. Examples of projects awarded community grants include the Benalla Aquatic Centre water safety and survival program for Grade 5 and 6 students and the Benalla Bushwalking Club for first aid training.

Major event funding recipients include the Austin 7 Club for Historic Winton and the Benalla Migrant Camp Inc. to fund a major reunion.

Every year, these grants provide funds to community groups and event organisers to support projects, activities and events.

ROAD MANAGEMENT

Traffic management, road maintenance and repair work is important. In recent months we have completed the following projects:

- Completed extension of a dangerous culvert at Steep Lane, Lurg
- Replaced 18 lineal metres of kerb and channel in Perth Street, Benalla
- Replaced 64 square metres of concrete footpaths, including in Clarke Street and Bridge Street, Benalla



- 106 box culverts and lids delivered in readiness for the Devenish Drainage project (pictured).
- Grader drainage works completed on Amery Road South, Boweya, Hunter Lane, Benalla and Boweya St James Road, Boweya

Minor projects completed:

- Daly Lane, Tatong drainage and pavement rehabilitation
- Irvine Road South, Thoona drainage rehabilitation
- Tiger Hill Road, Tatong drainage rehabilitation
- Old Lurg Road, Lurg pavement repair
