Each year the Victorian Government undertakes a survey on behalf of all local councils to measure the community's perception of the Council's performance over a period of 12 months.

This year, we are proud that the Council's overall performance rating is the highest it has been since we began tracking results in 2012. There was a significant improvement in the results from last year, with more than four times as many residents rating the Council's overall performance as 'good' or 'very good' than those who rate it as 'poor' or 'very poor', so thank you for your endorsement and support.



In this new financial year, we continue to focus on responding to what is important to the community. We know there are areas where we can continue to get better and we will keep working on that.

It is a great time to reflect on the pride we have in our community. The Freedom of Entry Ceremony recently held on 16

## PROPERTY VALUATIONS

All properties are now valued every year by the Valuer General Victoria. The rates you pay are apportioned according to the value and type of your property. Higher valued properties contribute more and lower valued properties contribute less.

If you feel your property has been incorrectly valued, see the back of your Valuation, Rate, Charge and Levy Notice and contact the Council's Customer Service Centre.


## HOW DO YOU PAY YOUR RATES?

Would you like to receive your Rate Notice electronically? It means you can conveniently view it and pay it with the click of a button. You will also receive reminders when payment is due.

This is done via BPAY View. To set this up, log on to your online banking and choose the BPAY View or View Bills option. Follow the prompts to register for Benalla Rural City Council, using the Biller Code 767657 and the reference number shown on your Valuation, Rate, Charge and Levy Notice.

If you are having trouble setting up BPAY View, contact your online banking provider.

- Organised traffic management and clean up for the HMAS Benalla Freedom of Entry
