Residents and visitors to Benalla now have a map of facilities and paths that are accessible to people of all abilities. The project involved a partnership between the Council and the Disability Advocacy and Information Service (DAIS), with funding from the RACV Good Citizen Program. BPACC GETS HELP FROM ITS FRIENDS



The Benalla Performing Arts and Convention Centre (BPACC) was built in 2004, a partnership between Goulburn Ovens TAFE and the Council. After the complex was built, members of the public were invited to support the newly formed 'Friends of BPACC' via an annual subscription.

With the opening of BPACC Cinema there was a need for ushers. Friends of BPACC and other volunteers provide ushering for weekly cinema sessions. Theatre productions also rely on volunteer ushers. Volunteering at BPACC is a great way to stay connected with the performing arts while also meeting people who have a shared interest in cinema, drama, music or dance.

The Friends have also purchased or contributed to the purchase of items

for BPACC including individual chairs for the auditorium, a large screen TV for the foyer, the digital projector, cinema lighting for the entrance, and in partnership with the Rotary Club of Benalla, outdoor seating.

Part of her role includes the running of the Benalla Visitor Information Centre. The Centre is the first point of call to the many visitors to our town. "Visitors come to us for things to see and do, accommodation, maps, merchandise and help to get to their next location." The Visitor Information Centre is a fully accredited part of a strong network not only in Victoria but Australia wide. "I am very passionate about tourism and the role Visitor Information Centres play."

Volunteering at the Centre includes participating in 'familis' where volunteers get to experience what Benalla has to offer first hand. Parks Victoria recently took some of the volunteers to Mt Samaria National Park. Volunteers have also been to the

Benalla Art Gallery for a guided tour of the Brett Whiteley exhibition and to the Benalla Migrant Camp.

Alison says "the most important asset that volunteers need to have at the Visitor Information Centre is a SMILE! The role is about providing good quality customer service and assisting our visitors." Volunteers work collaboratively with the Historical Society in regards to the Costume and Kelly museum. The role involves on-the-job training and you will learn something new every shift. The Centre is a seven day a week operation with two shifts per day and offers flexibility for volunteer hours.
