### LIBRARY GETS SOLAR

The Sir Edward "Weary" Dunlop Learning Centre is having solar panels installed.

The panels allow us to operate our venues in a greener, more cost effective and sustainable way.

The estimated annual electricity savings are around \$25,000 and 93 tonnes of greenhouse gas.

The installation is part of the Local Government Energy Savers Program with funding from Sustainability Victoria.

Through the Local Government Energy Savers Program, the Council has also installed solar panels at the Senior Citizens Community Centre, and LED lighting at the Senior Citizens Community Centre, Town Hall, Library and Benalla Art Gallery.

During an emergency, the Council works with other support and emergency service agencies. It also contributes to the prevention, preparedness, response to and recovery from emergencies. The main emergencies within Benalla Rural City Council are bushfires and floods.

### **WORKS AROUND BENALLA RURAL CITY**



We've upgraded the shared pathway between Noarana Drive and Evan James Drive. Local foot traffic can now use the pathway during wet weather because of the improvements.

We've completed the reseal of the footpath on Mackellar Street from Barkly Street and Nunn Street.



Faithful Street has had a new footpath constructed between Second and Third Avenues. This 215 metre stretch improves accessibility for residents.


The footpath is 1.5 metres wide to meet Australian Standards for access and mobility. This new path now connects all the way from Third Avenue to Goodwin Street.

### GRADER



We've been busy in the Winton Lurg and Molyullah areas. We've also worked in Taminik and Goomalibee, where we've graded fire access and limited access roads.

We've had a grader working on the Winton-Lurg Road project. We use the grader to improve access and drainage to the properties along the road and on adjoining roads, including Coleman Road.
