More than \$2 million budgeted for roadworks



More than \$1 million budgeted for drainage works

2021/2022 BUDGET

A RESPONSIBLE BUDGET THAT DELIVERS FOR THE COMMUNITY

The 2021/2022 budget has been adopted and is available to read online.

The budget includes a record \$13.389 million capital works program. We received \$7.322 in funding from the Victorian and Australian Governments for capital works. This means that while we grow our community's assets, we are able to maintain a financially responsible budget and continue to deliver our wide range of services. Highlights of the budget include a \$3 million upgrade to the Benalla Art Gallery and \$2.014 million redevelopment of the Benalla Visitor Information Centre.

Roadworks total \$2.140 million and \$1.144 million will be invested into drainage works.

The budget includes a 1.50 percent rate increase in line with the Victorian Government's Fair Go Rates system. Forecast operating revenue is \$36.519 million with operating expenses of \$34.566 million resulting in an operating surplus of \$1.953 million.

Waste management charges increase by 5 percent and are budgeted to raise \$3.751 million.

No new borrowings are proposed for 2021/2022. Debt decreases by more than \$1 million to \$3.804 million by 30 June 2022.

- Repainted the outdoor pool
- Repaired the program pool's water supply

We're also installing new shade sails for the grassed area of the outdoor pool.

GRADER ISSUES DURING WET WEATHER

Surface road conditions can deteriorate faster in wet weather than during warmer months. Unfortunately, just when you need the grader most, wet weather also complicates how we manage our road network. Using the grader in wet weather can make some roads worse.

We know that some roads are scheduled to be graded and we need to wait for clear weather. If there are dangerous conditions on your road, always let us know as soon as possible.

WORKS AROUND BENALLA

We've been clearing gutters to make sure the wet weather doesn't cause pooling on the road.

We've been performing routine fire plug inspections and replacing damaged or worn markers. Fire plugs are often covered over with growth or, worse still, vandalised. They are an important tool for the CFA to identify and access water in built-up areas during emergencies.

Works on Waller Street's kerb, channel and drainage have continued as we complete installation of the underground drainage system.
