ARG IMPROVING ACCESS FOR ALL

The Accessibility Reference Group (ARG) was established in 2015 and involves community representatives passionate about improving community access and inclusion for people of all ages and abilities. The ARG meets monthly and aims to help the Council respond to access and inclusion needs of the community and provide feedback on Council policy, planning and programs.

Major achievements for the ARG include the launch of the Benalla Mobility Map in 2017 and the Council's Community Access accreditation. This means that Council staff at the Customer Service Centre, Benalla Art Gallery and BPACC are trained to assist customers who have communication difficulties. The Group is now assisting with a review of the Council's Community Access and Inclusion Plan. We congratulate the ARG for their commitment to creating an inclusive and accessible environment for everyone.

VIC PUTTING BENALLA ON THE MAP

Volunteers from the Visitor Information Centre (VIC) exhibited at the annual Seymour Alternative Farming Expo for the first time earlier this year. Visitors to the Benalla VIC stall were keen to see and hear what Benalla has to offer.
