In Victoria, a permit is required to remove, destroy or lop native vegetation in most circumstances.

Native vegetation refers to all plants indigenous to Victoria, including trees, shrubs, herbs and grasses.

The Guidelines for the removal, destruction or lopping of native vegetation provide three steps for land managers and owners considering vegetation clearing:

1. Is it possible to avoid removing,

destroying or lopping native vegetation?

- 2. If it can't be avoided, can you minimise the impact of the clearing?
- Provide an offset to compensate for 3. the impact your clearing has on local biodiversity.

It's your responsibility to find out whether you need a planning permit. Contact us to confirm your requirements.
