BENALLA LANDFILL AND RESOURCE RECOVERY CENTRE CELL 2 UPDATE

The Council is constructing a second cell at the Benalla Landfill and Resource Recovery Centre. Each landfill cell serves our community for a number of years, depending on the size of the cell and the amount of waste that is diverted away from the cell by our recycling and organics collections.

Construction of the previous cell was completed in 2015 and will be at its capacity by early 2019.

Work on this second cell will be done in two stages. The first stage is the bulk earthworks, which is digging the hole. This will be completed later in 2018.

The second stage is the fitting of the clay liner and plastics, aggregate and leachate collection systems, which begins at the completion of Stage 1.

EPA audits and approval processes begin after the completion of Stage 2.

The project is being overseen by landfill specialists. This is a big infrastructure project and will cost more than \$1M to complete. This cell is likely to serve the community for two years.



The Council runs a Social Support Activities Program through its Community Services department.

Through the program, volunteers run excursions that create opportunities for community participation and social interaction. The program is for older people or younger people (under 65) with a disability.

Can you spare from three to six hours either once a week or fortnight? The program needs volunteers for women's, men's and mixed social groups that meet on a Monday, Tuesday or Wednesday.

ADVOCATING FOR BETTER PASSENGER RAIL

Passenger rail transport is critical in our region. Many members of our community have been inconvenienced and had their travel disrupted by problems with the line due to weather and equipment faults.

The Council is advocating (lobbying) for better passenger rail services through the north east, as part of the Melbourne to Albury Passenger Rail Collaboration.

It has been announced that \$100M is allocated in the Federal Budget for work on the north east network and the Collaboration is working closely with the Federal Government to see exactly what this includes.

The Collaboration is also working with the State Government to ensure the continued upgrade of the rolling stock, which is the actual carriages and trains.

GOORAMBAT THOONA BRIDGE WORKS

The Goorambat Thoona Bridge, which is on the Goorambat Thoona Road, has had the road and shoulders widened and a new concrete deck overlay and guardrails installed.

Regular inspections found the bridge had developed stress fractures, most likely due to increased traffic loads which includes larger trucks.

The new concrete deck overlay will extend the life of the bridge by approximately 50 years. The remaining work is for the widened road and shoulders to be sealed. The bridge is open for traffic.
