MAYOR'S MESSAGE - 2018/19 COUNCIL BUDGET

The 2018/19 Council Budget is a turning point in our municipality's history. Why, you ask? Because it's the year the meaning of rate capping has really hit home. Balancing the Budget while delivering all the services the Council is responsible for has become a massive and difficult task. We remain committed to our election promise of concentrating on the fundamentals at the core of Local Government.

2018/19 will also be a turning point in other ways. It will see the commissioning of two

new large employers in our community (the concrete batching plant and the 120 bed aged care facility), extensions to Benalla P-12 and Cooinda Village. This is set to be the largest investment and construction period in Benalla's history.

The Council is aware that all this expansion comes with challenges that must be managed. We keep in mind that we have to maintain the wonderful environment that is Benalla Rural City.

BENALLA LANDFILL AND RESOURCE RECOVERY CENTRE - CELL 2 UPDATE

The Council is constructing a second EPA compliant, fully lined cell at the Benalla Landfill and Resource Recovery Centre. Construction of the previous cell was completed in 2015 and will be at its capacity by early 2019.

The second cell is being constructed in two stages. The material excavation of the bulk earthworks is complete. Minor works, including the construction of haul roads, crossings, storm water drains, bunding and placement of top soil are being finalised before handover. These works complete Stage 1 of the Cell.

The EPA conducted a detailed design audit of Stage 2 of the Cell and provided conditions to be met in the construction. The approval was received on 11 April 2018.

We are now in the procurement stages of Stage 2, which will involve the installation of the cell lining.



NEW JOHN DEERE GRADER ON THE ROAD

Have you seen our replacement grader? We have acquired a John Deere grader under our plant replacement program. The grader it replaced was almost 14 years old and had clocked up more than 15,200 hours of service. The normal life expectancy of a grader is 10-12 years.

The new grader has a 14 foot blade compared to the previous grader's 12 foot blade.

The grader will be working through Baddaginnie, Stewarton, Devenish, Chesneyvale and Thoona during May.
