New playgrounds to brighten our parks



Benalla families can now enjoy new playgrounds throughout the district with four playgrounds recently receiving upgrades.

The playgrounds provide a great public area for the local community to come together, socialise and play, and will improve the overall amenity of local townships.

The locations are:

- Bicentennial Park, Devenish
- Cook Street Reserve, Benalla
- Jaycee Island Reserve, Benalla
- Mackellar Street Reserve, Benalla.

Proposed sculpture to honour Arthur Baird

Council is seeking community input for the proposed installation of a commissioned sculpture piece, dedicated to Arthur Baird, the first chief engineer for Qantas and an inductee into the Australian Aviation Hall of Fame.

Commissioned by Victorian artist, Alex Sanson, the sculpture is based on a de Havilland DH-50 aircraft and spans more than five metres high. The work, constructed entirely of satin-finish marine grade stainless steel, is

carefully balanced to move freely in the wind.

The proposed location for the sculpture is outside the Sir Edward 'Weary' Dunlop Learning Centre. Local community members Barry O'Connor and Beverley 'Chick' Walker researched the achievements and career of Arthur Baird and then presented this research to Council with the proposal of honouring Baird with a permanent memorial.

EV Charging Station coming to Benalla

Works to install a public electric vehicle (EV) charger at Benalla's Denny Street carpark are currently underway.

Council is supporting EV charger company Evie Networks who are installing a 50kW EV charger, servicing two parking bays in the Denny Street carpark.

Council is also finalising negotiations on a separate charging station with Tesla.

The installation of these chargers is in line with Council's commitment to support the community to reduce their greenhouse gas emissions.
