Strong half year financial result

The Council has realised a \$442,000 favourable operating result for the half year to 31 December 2016.

The result includes a \$285,000 saving in employee costs after the 2016 staff restructure. This comes from an internally driven strategy of reducing overheads and staff numbers, realising a \$1.1M reduction in operating costs.

FAST FACTS Volunteers in 2016

Volunteers delivered 11,090 meals.

The 'Litter Gatherers' each collect on average 140 litres of litter per week.

L2P volunteers travelled 50,000 km, and helped 18 young people to get their licence in 2016.

Volunteers at BPACC ushered 15,575 patrons.

More than 12,000 visitors were helped by volunteers at the Visitor Information Centre to make the most of their visit.

Unregistered pet?

The *Domestic Animals Act 1994* requires all dogs and cats over three months old to be microchipped and registered with the Council.

Registrations are an annual charge and must be renewed by 10 April each year. You can still register your pet if you have missed the deadline, but don't delay - unregistered pets may result in a fine. If you have a new animal to register please ensure you have the microchip details available.
